

Why is this so important?


- › We live in a challenging culture for young Christians
 - 50-70% of young Christians will walk away from their faith by the time they are in college¹
 - In a recent UCLA study, 52% of college students reported frequent church attendance before entering college; only 29% reported the same by the end of their Junior year²
- › Parents need resources, support, and encouragement to respond to a generation of students unlike any other
 - The worldview of GenZ is highly inclusive and individualistic; they admire parents but don't find family relationships central to their sense of self
 - They came of age post-9/11 and 2008 Great Recession and are driven to be “happy” which many define as education attainment and financial success³
- › Gen Z's crave relationships – but likely not from family




Culture. Exiles. Resilient Disciples.

› Culture

- *cultura* – Latin meaning agriculture.
- Not the same thing as creation
- Not just the “bad” stuff







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› Exiles

- Just like Jews exiled to Babylon, Christians today live in a culture that challenges many of their beliefs

- “All of us are exiles. We live in Digital Babylon,” conclusion of Barna’s research

› Babylon of the bible is characterized as a collective of human pursuits in opposition to God.

- Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego
- Peter in his letters to the Christian Church and John in the Book of Revelation
- Exiles learned a new language, economic system, and social norms – it was part of the assimilation process
- Exiles came to know Babylon’s power, prestige, and pride as their hearts and minds were colonized

› Digital Babylon

- The internet colonizes our culture
- Hyper connected. Fear of missing out
- Church is less important – replaced by other activities
- Online and consumer church makes it easy to find a “faith outlet” that “works for me”

› Four Types of Exiles



22% - Prodigals (Ex-Christians)



30% - Nomads (Unchurched)



38% - Habitual Churchgoers



10% - Resilient Disciples



Right now, what religious faith do you consider yourself to be? Christian*












Finding Identity in Jesus


I believe living in relationship with Jesus is the only way to find fulfillment in life




My relationship with Jesus brings me deep joy and satisfaction
